DAILY DEVOTIONAL



Set the Tone:

This week, we're diving into Revelation 7—a chapter that stunned me with God's relentless love and mercy. My prayer is that you'll see how much Jesus loves you—more than the breath in His lungs—and that this truth will fuel your hope and boldness.

God's Mercy Holds Back the Storm

Monday

READ REVELATION 7:1-3

1 After this I saw four angels standing at the four corners of the earth, holding back the four winds of the earth, that no wind might blow on earth or sea or against any tree. 2 Then I saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun, with the seal of the living God, and he called with a loud voice to the four angels who had been given power to harm earth and sea, 3 saying, "Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees, until we have sealed the servants of our God on their foreheads."

STUDY NOTES

"Four winds" - chaos and judgment ready to strike, but God says, "Not yet."

"Sealed" - God's mark of protection.

REFLECTION:

Growing up, my mom would say, "I love you more than the breath in my lungs." It bothered me—without breath, she'd be gone. But she explained it's about a love so deep she'd give everything. Jesus showed that kind of love when he died on the cross for our sin. He further shows that love in Revelation 7, holding back destruction to give more time for people to know Him.

Why do you think God paused the judgment after Revelation 6's chaos?

What does this tell you about God's heart for humanity?

Satan wants our destruction, but God wants our devotion—where do you see that battle in your life?

ACTION STEP:

Pray this: "Jesus, thank You for loving me more than the breath in Your lungs. Open my eyes to Your mercy today. Keep me from Satan's lies and close to Your truth. Amen."

Tuesday

PRAYER: Lord, thank You for Your unfailing compassion and the ways You never stop pursuing us. As I open Your Word today, help me to trust in Your perfect methods, knowing that You always keep Your promises. Soften my heart to see where I need to rely on You more and give me boldness to share Your love with those around me. Amen.

READ REVELATION 7:2-4

2 Then I saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun, with the seal of the living God, and he called with a loud voice to the four angels who had been given power to harm earth and sea, 3 saying, "Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees, until we have sealed the servants of our God on their foreheads." 4 And I heard the number of the sealed, 144,000, sealed from every tribe of the sons of Israel

STUDY NOTES

"144,000" - Jewish believers in the Tribulation, specially protected by God to share the gospel.

God's methods never run out—He keeps His promises to Israel and uses them to reach the world.

REFLECTION:

Why does God protect these 144,000?

How does this show He's never out of ways to reach people?

Think about Jesus dying for you—how does that prove His compassion never quits?

Is there an area of your life that could never be fixed or changed without God's help?

Where do you need to trust His methods in your life right now?

ACTION STEP:

Write down one way God has shown up in your life or kept a promise to you. Take as long as you need for this. Thank Him for His compassion that never runs out.

Wednesday Devo

READ REVELATION 7:9-10

9 After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, **10** and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!"

STUDY NOTES

This crowd—countless souls saved through the 144,000's witness—shows God's miracles never stop.

"White robes" - washed by Jesus' blood, a miracle of grace.

"our God" - These same voices that rejected God before the tribulation have come to know God in the tribulation and praise God in heaven. If that is not a miracle I dont know what is.

REFLECTION:

What does this "multitude" tell you about God's love reaching every corner of the earth?

How does Jesus' sacrifice make this scene possible?

Satan bends truth to blind people (2 Corinthians 4:4)—how has Jesus' truth set you free?

Who is one person you can share God's goodness with today?

ACTION STEP:

Pray for someone you know who's far from God. Ask Jesus to use you to share His hope.

Wednesday Small Group Discussion

ICE BREAKER QUESTION (5 MINUTES)

Share a time someone showed you love when you didn't expect it. How did it feel?

Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen." 13 Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?" 14 I said to him, "Sir, you know." And he said to me, "These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. 15 "Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. 16 They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat. 17 For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

GROUP CHALLENGE: PURSUING TRUE PEACE IN JESUS

Follow up: Last week, we chose to pursue real peace in Jesus. How did it go? What was one moment where you had to choose between stressing out or trusting Him?

This week, as a group, choose one way to share the hope of Jesus with someone. (See Thursdays Challenge for examples)

KEY TAKEAWAYS FROM SUNDAY'S MESSAGE + QUESTIONS

- I GOD IS NEVER OUT OF MERCY (REVELATION 7:1-3)
- Even after the devastation of Revelation 6, God pauses judgment to give people more time to turn to Him.
- Satan's goal is complete destruction, but God restrains evil because of His mercy (1 Peter 5:8).
- Question: How does God holding back judgment (Revelation 7:1) show He's never out of mercy?

GOD IS NEVER OUT OF METHODS (REVELATION 7:4-8)

- God seals and protects 144,000 Jewish believers, using them to spread the gospel during the Tribulation.
- Even in judgment, God is still reaching people, proving that His promises never fail (2 Corinthians 4:3-4).
- Question: What's inspiring about the 144,000 being "sealed" to share the gospel? (Revelation 7:4)

3 GOD IS NEVER OUT OF MIRACLES (REVELATION 7:9-17)

- A countless crowd is saved through the witness of the 144,000, proving God's love never stops pursuing people.
- In eternity, Jesus will be our Shepherd, and every tear will be wiped away (Revelation 7:17).
- Question: How does the multitude in white robes give you hope? (Revelation 7:9-10)

ADDITIONAL DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

What hit you most from Sunday's message on Revelation 7?

Why do you think Satan hates us so much, and how does God's love counter that? (Genesis 1:26-27)

Why should our hope in Jesus be the biggest marker of our lives?

Who's one person you (or we as a group) can share Jesus' love with this week?

PRAYER:

Thank God for loving us more than the breath in His lungs.

Pray for boldness to share the gospel like the 144,000.

Ask Him to reach those still blinded by Satan's lies.

Thursday

READ JOHN 15:13

Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends.

REFLECTION:

How does this connect to Jesus' mercy in Revelation 7?

What does it mean that Jesus gave His life for you? Spend some time and try to think of all the ways that impacts you.

Where do you need to lean on His love today?

CHALLENGE:

Sharing the hope of Jesus isn't just for pastors, missionaries, or the 144,000 in Revelation—it's for all of us. God has never been out of mercy, methods, or miracles, and He still works through His people today.

This week, find one way to share the hope of Jesus with someone:

- Pray for someone who needs encouragement and let them know you're praying for them.
- Start a faith conversation with a friend, classmate, or teammate—ask about their beliefs and share what Jesus means to you.
- Serve someone in need—help a neighbor, classmate, or family member in a way that reflects God's love.
- Invite someone to church or share a sermon, devotional, or Scripture with them.

Who is one person you can share the hope of Jesus with this week?

PRAYER

Jesus, thank You for showing me the greatest love by laying down Your life for me. Your mercy never runs out, and Your love never fails. Help me to truly understand what it means to live in that love and share it with others. Give me boldness to bring hope to someone who needs it this week. Open my eyes to opportunities to serve, encourage, or speak truth into someone's life. Let my actions reflect the love You have shown me. Amen.

Made in His Image

Friday

START WITH PRAYER: God, thank You for creating me in Your image and giving me worth that no one can take away. As I spend time in Your Word today, help me see the depth of Your love and protection. Open my eyes to the ways Satan tries to distort the truth, and remind me that I belong to You. Thank You for fighting for me and never giving up on me. I invite You to speak to my heart today. Amen.

READ GENESIS 1:26-27

26 Then God said, "Let us make man[a] in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." **27** So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

REFLECTION:

Why does Satan hate that we're made in God's image? Here are some additional Verses that might be helpful (1 Peter 5:8, Colossians 1:15-17, 2 Corinthians 4:4)

How does God protecting His people in Revelation 7 show His value for you?

PRAYER:

Jesus, thank You for loving me enough to fight for me. Even when Satan tries to deceive, destroy, and pull me away, You never stop pursuing me. You have claimed me as Yours, protected me, and given me a purpose. Help me to live in the confidence of who I am in You and to reflect Your love to those around me. Amen.

A Hope Worth Sharing

Saturday

READ REVELATION 7:17

For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.

REFLECTION:

What are some of the differences in the experiences of Revelation 7:17 and Revelation 6:13-17?

What are some of the differences in the way you talked about God before and after you became a Christian?

What's one way Jesus has guided you lately?

Our hope shouldn't be a secret—how can you share it today?

PRAYER:

Jesus, thank You for never running out of love. Make me bold to share You.
